Job title: Pharmacist

Job description:

Preparation of and dispensing of Drugs

Qualifications required:

NCEA Level 3 Maths, English, Biology, Chemistry and Physics are essential. Excellent communication and mathematical skills, close attention to detail. 4 year Bachelor of Pharmacy Degree

Training costs:

University of Otago – four year degree course – approximately \$20-\$25k. University of Auckland – four year course – approximately \$20-\$25k.

Location of job:

Mostly within a dispensary located either in a community or hospital pharmacy.

Career path:

Pharmacists work in both community and hospital pharmacies. The roles vary considerably with progression possible down a number of routes in both areas. There are options for specialising in clinical pharmacy, carrying out research, studying further towards a PhD and/or Masters in Pharmacy. There are teaching and training roles in Universities and tertiary education providers, information and advice roles in professional pharmacy bodies and government departments.

Salary range:

The starting salary for a newly qualified pharmacist in their Internship year is around \$13.50ph rising to between \$15 and \$20ph as the year progresses. Once registered, a pharmacist can expect to earn around \$30-\$40ph with future options including managing and/or owning their own pharmacy.

The skills developed by pharmacists can be applied across a wide range of areas particularly management, training and teaching, research and Government departments, as well as other areas of the health sector.

Talk to your local pharmacist and/or get a part-time job in a pharmacy.
